Treeproject tubestock, grown by volunteers in the city, is now available at cost [30cents each].

Species this year are as follows:-

Large trees - messmate, candlebark, manna gum, snow gum, narrow-leaf peppermint.

Medium trees - blackwood, silver wattle, black wattle, drooping she-oak

Shrubs - woolly tea-tree, prickly tea-tree, river bottlebrush, Prickly Moses, Indigofera

Ground layer - common tussock grass, common wallaby grass
