Administrative support is required from the membership to action the following:







ORGANICS — Solutions to Climate Change by Peter Eisen

The Third Organic Federation of Australia National Conference at Darling Harbour, Sydney. 22nd -- 23rd July 2006

This Conference was a stimulating and instructive experience; 33 papers and presentations covering sustainable soils for climate change, soil fertility, soil biology, strategic feeding of ruminants, pasture cropping and many more topics. Many of the participants were scientists, academics and business leaders. However, the most impressive input came from farmers who were applying organic principles to their farming activities, and, from Dr Elaine Ingham, Director of the Soil Web Institute.

Many interesting statistics like: Humus stores 20 times its weight of water; 1 tonne per hectare increase in organic soil material takes 3.7 tonnes CO2 from the atmosphere. Ingham's detailed research into the composition and activity of soil biology essentially in the form of compost provides a very useful framework within which to work on soil improvement and a sustainable environment. Just imagine, every gram of healthy soil biomass contains 25000 species of bacteria, 8000 species of fungi, along with protozoa, nematodes, microarthropods and earthworms. These are the "workers" of the soil biology that plants need to achieve optimal growth. All from quality compost. And plants grown organically can significantly reduce CO2 in the atmosphere.
