2012-2013 Activities report at 2013 AGM

As the group approaches its 10th year we can be proud of our group and its achievements since May 2004 - visible changes to the landscape, knowledge acquired and shared, the sense of community built and our strong association with the Primary School.

Emphasis has continued to be on activities that support our major strategic goal of improving biodiversity within the Campaspe-Maribyrnong Headwaters Biolink area or environmental education at Newham Primary School.

During 2012-2013 a data base of sites for inclusion in a larger scale project was initiated in anticipation of a Federal funding round opening [in the 2013-2014 financial year] that will allow for on-ground works in our area.

Membership has continued to sit at around 100 households.

Highlights of the year

- Hanging Rock Revegetation.
 - 2 planting days were held at Hanging Rock Reserve. The first in Spring 2012 saw the 2011-2013 grant activities completed [planting of an additional 600 tubestock]. Another Communities for Nature grant of \$5310 for works at HRR was obtained by Nick Massie early in 2013. A contractor dealt with blackberry and other woody weeds before a group planting day in Autumn 600 tubestock were planted on this day and the volunteers enjoyed a great BBQ lunch afterwards.
- **Roadside management group** continues to map roadside weeds for MRSC, to facilitate spraying, and also undertake hands-on sessions to deal with woody weeds in roadside remnant.
- **Newham Primary School Propagating group** has grown over 8000 plants to order for local Melbourne Water Stream Frontage Program recipients and projects managed by the Landcare group. Organized by Penny Roberts, with parents and grandparents from Newham Primary providing the man=power, this group has been raising funds for the school landscaping sine 2010.
- **Supply of cheap indigenous native plants to members** over 2000 tube-stock were distributed. These were grown by the propagating group and several members who had previously been volunteer growers for TreeProject.
- Clean Up Australia Day efforts, organised by Nick Massie, were again well supported by our members.
